

MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Fort Riley Environmental Management Policy

1. Fort Riley, as an Installation of Excellence, working in close partnership with local, regional and state communities, provides trained and ready forces to meet Joint Force requirements across the full spectrum of current and future operations; Fort Riley transforms and builds units and manages its readiness as directed by the Army Campaign Plan; executes unit re-stationing as directed by the Army; executes garrison operations as directed by Installation Management Command, and conducts homeland defense operations and supports civil authorities.
2. Integration of an Environmental Management System (EMS) with operations and realistic training conditions enhances our mission. The EMS provides the framework for Fort Riley to achieve its strategic planning objectives - to sustain and improve environmental resources and installation facilities, in order to support readiness and quality of life.
3. To support and protect the Soldier, maximize military preparedness, and manage our environmental impacts, Fort Riley commits to:
 - a. continually improve our management of the installation's significant environmental aspects;
 - b. comply with applicable legal and other requirements;
 - c. prevent pollution and promote waste stream reduction;
 - d. integrate environmental consideration into all activities; and
 - e. conserve, protect, and restore natural and cultural resources.
4. Fort Riley employs its Environmental Quality Control Council and Garrison Commander's Quarterly Status Brief as venues to periodically evaluate environmental activities and measure performance against established objectives.
5. This policy applies to all active duty, reserve component, and National Guard Soldiers; civilian, tenant contract employees; and other persons assigned to, or conducting business at Fort Riley.
