

SPILLS FACT SHEET

- A spill is any release of a hazardous substance that could potentially harm human health and/or enter the environment.
- The most common hazardous substances spilled on Fort Riley are antifreeze, oils, and fuels.



Emergency/Level II Spill

A spill is defined as an emergency when any one of the following occurs:

- More than Five gallons are spilled;
- Human health or the environment is threatened;
- Hazardous waste is spilled;
- The spill enters a waterway (storm drain, lake, stream, etc.)
- The organization does not have the capability to control the leak and/or contain the spill;
- The spill occurs after facility duty hours.



NOTIFICATION PROCEDURES

If you find or witness an **emergency spill** immediately notify the Post Emergency Services at 911, who will then contact the appropriate offices; (Fire Department, (Spill Coordinator)).

A **non-emergency spill** must be reported to the Environmental Division Spill Coordinator verbally, within 24 hours, at 239-8615.
