The new Army Core Curriculum, as mandated by the Veteran's Opportunity to Work (VOW) Hero to Hires Act of 2011, consists of courses that include an Orientation/ Transition Overview, Military Occupation Codes (MOC) Crosswalk, Military Family Concerns, Value of a Mentor/Special Issues and Individual Transition Plan (ITP) Review.
